General Disclaimer

The drugs used in this study may have side effects, some of which are listed below. Please note that this list does not include all the side effects. These lists include the more serious or common side effects with known or possible relationship to the drugs. If you have questions concerning the additional treatment side effects, please ask the medical staff at your site.

Risk of Antibacterials

Some medications used to treat TB may be associated with diarrhea (loose or watery bowels), including bloody diarrhea, which may be serious.

Rifapentine (RPT/Priftin)

Sanofi Aventis

The following side effects have been associated with the use of rifapentine:

- Reddish coloring of urine, sweat, sputum, saliva, tears, and breast milk. Stains to your contact lenses and dentures that may not go away.
- Liver damage; if you develop any of the following symptoms, you should call your doctor right away:
 - Unexplained loss of appetite
 - Nausea and or vomiting
 - Pale colored stools
 - Yellowing of the eyes or skin
 - Pain in the upper abdomen (where your stomach is)
 - Dark urine

Additional side effects may include:

- Loss of appetite
- Low blood counts
- Low blood sugar
- Decreased effectiveness of hormonal birth control (contraceptives) and other medications, including some anti-HIV medications. Tell your doctor about all medications that you are taking.
